Wreaths Across America Event - W1A

The Maine Ham Radio Society is, once again, conducting a special event honoring Wreaths Across America, their volunteers, and our nations' veterans. The dates are December 15 - 18 and coincide with National Wreaths Across America Day. Each December WAA leaves Washington County Maine in a massive convoy of big rigs, escort vehicles including police and fire vehicles, and makes their way to Arlington National Cemetery as well as other The second annual special event honoring Wreaths Across America, volunteers, and veterans! veteran's cemeteries across the nation, where they place Christmas wreaths on American veterans' graves. The organization even lays wreaths on U.S. veterans graves in Normandy, France, and other overseas locations.

Maine Parks-On-The-Air

An effort is underway to get all Maine ham radio clubs and as many individuals as possible to activate a qualified Maine park for Parks-On-The-Air on the same date.

Jeff Hanscom, KA1DBE, Assistant Maine Section Manager, and President of the Ellsworth Amateur Wireless Association, is asking clubs and hams to put a Maine park on the air on Saturday, May 18 so that as many qualified entities as possible can be worked by other Maine stations and hams throughout America and the globe. There are 34 state parks, 4 national parks, and dozens of other qualified lands such as national wildlife reserves, that can be activated.
